


The size of the CITY fields throughout PDS is 15 characters in length, which works most of the time. But if you are selling in San Juan Capistrano, or Rancho Cucamonga, or Santa Fe Springs, or Palos Verdes Estates, or City of Commerce and the like, then you are certainly creating your own abbreviations and taking your chances on your mail getting delivered.

Here's a way around it: Shown above is the latest version of Zip Code Maintenance. Field 6 has been added as a 24-byte Long Name City which can serve as an override in select places.

Once these longer names are in place in the Zip Maintenance, we tweak those places that count, such as the invoice and statement print programs, to check here for an Override City to replace the one coming from the Customer file. This creates the illusion, to the Post Office anyway, that your system supports a 24-byte city.

Cost: An hour, plus 15 minutes per document, with most common being Invoice, Statement, C/L invoice.
